PRIMARY SCHOOL



### SEN

(Special Educational Needs)

A child or young person has SEN if they have a learning difficulty or disability that makes it harder for them to learn than most children of the same age.



### SEN SUPPORT

The support provided in school to help children and young people with SEN to make progress and achieve their best.



### EHCP

(Education, Health and Care Plan)

A legal document for children and young people with significant and complex needs. It outlines their needs, the support they require and the outcomes we are working towards.



### OUTCOMES

The goals we help your child or young person work towards. They focus on what they want to achieve in the future.



### PROVISION

The support, resources and strategies put in place in school to help your child or young person achieve their outcomes.



### REVIEW

Regular meetings (at least once a year for an EHCP) to review progress and make sure the support in place is still right.



### SEND

(Special Educational Needs and Disabilities)

The term used to describe children and young people who have special educational needs or a disability.



### SENDIASS

(Information, Advice and Support Service)

A free, confidential service for children, young people and families to get information, advice and support about SEN. Bradford SENDIASS – **01274 435600**



### GRADUATED APPROACH

A cycle of Assess, Plan, Do, Review. We assess needs, plan support, put it in place and review the impact.
