#### TOP TIPS TO STAY SAFE NEVER GO ON THE ICE

UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES This includes attempting to rescue another person or animal who may have fallen through the ice.

ONLY USE WELL LIT AREAS Try to take walks in the daylight but if you must walk in the evening, only use well lit areas and avoid anywhere with wate

**KEEP AWAY FROM THE EDGE OF THE WATER** er go close to the edge or lean over to touch the bu may over balance or trip and fall in.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SEE SOMEONE FALL THROUGH THE ICE

Shout for "HELP" and dial 999 or 112 if you can

DO NOT walk on to the ice to attempt a rescue Shout to the person to "HEEP STILL" and offer reassurance.

If they are close enough, LIE DOWN TO AVOID OVERBALANCING and falling onto the ice, and try to reach them with a tree branch clothing tied together or anything else which can extend your reach.


If you cannot reach them, SLIDE SOMETHING which floats across the ice. such as a plastic bottle or a football, so that they can hold on to it to stay

afloat whilst help is on the way.

If they are too far away, WAIT FOR THE EMERGENCY SERVICES and reassure the casualty from the safety of the bank.
