I do want to remind families, if you have any concerns around friendships or bullying, please be assured, these are taken extremely seriously and we will respond as soon as we are aware of any concern. We work very hard in our school to make sure all of the children feel safe all of the time, we also teach our children the difference between falling out with a friend and bullying. In school we use the simple acronym **STOP** which means bullying is SEVERAL TIMES ON PURPOSE. STOP- START TELLING OTHER PEOPLE. Our children are very able to explain what to do if they feel they are being bullied and know we will make it stop.

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Safeguarding

According to Ofcom's annual study of children's relationship with the media and online worlds, 24% of 5 to 7 year olds own a smartphone. If the definition of devices is widened to tablets, that figure rises to 76%. It is so important that we must remain with a finger on the pulse of trends among this very young grouping. Their formative experiences in the online world, may be crucial in determining their future attitudes. This is particularly importance since a third of those surveyed use social media unsupervised. Profiles on social media sites can be found for those in that age bracket, which due to the nature of social media may be cause for concern.
